










The great white (also known more humbly as the white shark) has two genetically distinct populations in Australia: western whites range from Victoria to Western Australia while an eastern group moves from Tasmania to Queensland, shifting north in winter. That's similar to the annual movement of whales along the east coast, but it's not a straightforward chase. They can live to the age of 70.

The thugs of the shark world, bulls are jumpier than other species, with a blunt nose on a thick muscular body (and a tendency to headbutt their prey). They're tough, too, known to switch between salt oceans and freshwater rivers without skipping a beat. Their typical lifespan is 16 years.

Named for the stripes on their backs (which tend to fade with age), tiger sharks have a reputation as scavengers. A tiger at a Sydney aquarium famously helped solve a murder case in 1935 when it vomited a human arm with a distinctive tattoo. Tigers prefer warmer seas and can hunt in shallower water than other big sharks. They typically live for 15 years.




